

#### Nexus 2014: Water, Food, Climate and Energy Conference

The Water Institute at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and collaborators hosted the Nexus 2014: Water, Food, Climate and Energy Conference on March 5-8, 2014 to examine the thoughts and actions related to a nexus approach. The co-Directors of the Conference are Jamie Bartram, Director of The Water Institute, and Felix Dodds, Associate Fellow at the Tellus Institute, with support from an International Advisory Committee. The Conference brought together scientists and practitioners working in government, civil society and business, and other stakeholders to focus on the questions of how and why the nexus approach is, and can be, used on international and local levels.

#### **Nexus Declaration**

One of the primary goals of the Nexus 2014: Water, Food, Climate and Energy Conference was to provide input to the UN Sustainable Development Goals process. To do so a group of experts prepared a draft of the Nexus Declaration which was available for public comment. The final version of the declaration which incorporates public feedback is now available online and was delivered to the UN Secretary General on March 26.



#### Establishment of 'Social Science of the Nexus' Network Plus


#### Town meeting and invitation to submit an Expression of Interest

The Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) has recently undertaken a consultation exercise to identify the social science research priorities that emerge from a holistic assessment of the interrelated challenges of energy, environment and food security. This exercise has identified an interconnected set of social science challenges - the Social Science of the Nexus - from which ESRC, working with a range of partners, will be taking forward a programme of research and capacity-building.

The first of these activities is designed to forge links between research activities addressing the challenges of the Social Science of the Nexus. ESRC wants to establish a Network Plus (NW+) to build connected 'nexus thinking' capacity and leadership for the social sciences in identifying and addressing the challenges of the Energy-Environment-Food Nexus. The call is for a single Network Plus (NW+) to last for 36 months that will bring together researchers from across the Nexus funded to the level of up to £1.875 million (100 per cent fEC)) over 36 months.

#### What is a Network Plus?

A Network Plus plays a strategic role in ensuring that research is both of excellent academic quality AND is aligned with user needs. It plays a key role in reaching out to potential users, interacting with them and providing them with access to research, ensuring research addresses questions that are relevant to them, and uses the concepts and language that users understand and can apply. This is intended to be very different to the traditional process of dissemination which occurs after the research has finished. Instead, with a Network Plus, the research communities' engagement with research users is at its highest before the main body of research begins, and research users often play an active role in research design and its co-production. A Network Plus has a further strategic contribution in



## Vision & objectives



Vision: to achieve a step-change improvement in the provision of strategic research around food-energy-water-environment interdependencies that can improve policymaker, business and users decision-making.

#### Objectives:

- Build and sustain a network of social scientists, natural scientists and users from business, government and civil society
- Focus on the strategic needs of users, and shape an interdisciplinary research portfolio that targets opportunities, gaps and mismatches
- Engage proactively with business and align research with business needs & outcomes
- Support the social science research community to develop and share new data, conceptual frameworks, methodologies, skills and practices
- Provide a UK interface for international initiatives with nexus dimensions, e.g.
   Future Earth
- Synthesise the outcomes of network activities to inform ESRC policies and strategies




